## About J. Warren White, MD

These lectures honor J. Warren White, MD, who became the first chief surgeon of Shriners Hospital, Honolulu, in 1924. In 1927, he left Honolulu to serve as the first chief surgeon of Shriners Hospital, Greenville, a position he held until he returned to Honolulu in 1949. He continued as chief surgeon there until his death in 1957.

## Goals

1. To educate practicing orthopaedic physicians and residents on how to be an effective leader with personal stories from orthopaedic surgeons of national and world renown.
2. To educate orthopaedic surgeons on the principles of managing sports-related foot and ankle pathology and syndesmotic injuries.
3. To educate orthopaedic surgeons on the principles of managing chronic foot and ankle conditions related to diabetic ankle fractures and Charcot foot.

## Objectives

1. Develop an understanding of techniques to better manage complex foot and ankle sports pathology and syndesmotic injuries.
2. Develop an understanding of principles and techniques of managing diabetic complications in orthopaedic foot and ankle surgery.

## Speakers



**Bob Anderson, MD**, is the founding orthopaedic surgeon of the O.L. Miller Foot and Ankle Institute of OrthoCarolina in Charlotte, N.C. He recently joined the Titledown Sports Medicine and Orthopaedic Clinic in Green Bay. Dr. Anderson is

fellowship trained in foot and ankle disorders and has a wealth of experience in sport-related injuries. He served as a team orthopaedist to the Carolina Panthers from 2000-2017 and now is an associate team physician to the Green Bay Packers. Dr. Anderson has served as the chairman of the Foot and Ankle Subcommittee for the NFL since 2003 and recently was named the co-chair of the NFL's Musculoskeletal Committee, overseeing all orthopaedic injuries and research in professional football.



**Michael Pinzur, MD**, has focused a 40-year academic career on the care of the diabetic foot, limb salvage and amputee care. He completed a residency in Orthopaedic Surgery at Northwestern University in Chicago.

Dr. Pinzur has served as a consultant to the Surgeon General of the United States Army and has published over 300 peer-reviewed articles in scientific and medical journals. He currently serves as an associate editor of *Foot and Ankle International*. He is a professor of Orthopaedic Surgery and Rehabilitation at the Loyola University Health System in Chicago, Ill.

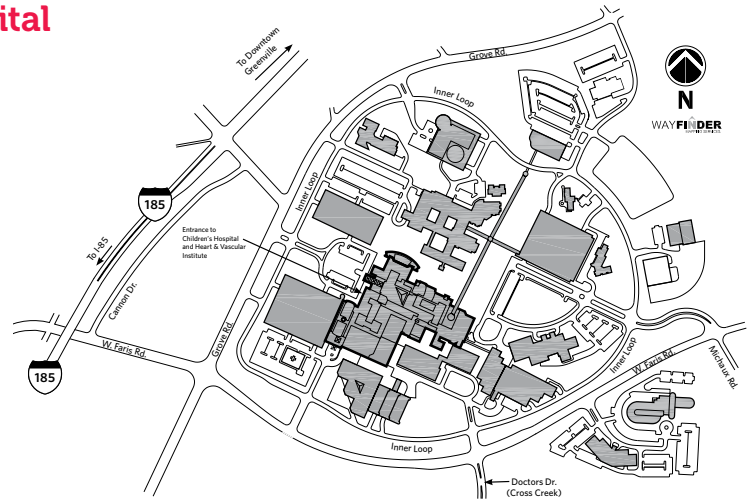

# Prisma Health Greenville Memorial Hospital

**From Atlanta, Ga.:** Take Interstate 85 North toward Greenville. Exit onto Interstate I-85 (Exit 42, Highway 29). At the traffic light, turn right onto Henrydale Avenue. Go one block to the next traffic light; turn right onto Grove Road.

**From Charlotte, N.C.:** Take Interstate 85 South toward Greenville. Take Exit 44 (White Horse Road) and turn right. International hospital signs are posted along this route. The road will be marked Highway 25. Go to the second traffic light; turn right onto Grove Road.

**From Columbia, S.C.:** Take Interstate 26 toward Greenville/Spartanburg. As you get closer to Greenville, I-26 will go to Spartanburg, but you should take I-385 toward Greenville. Travel on I-385 until you come to Exit I-85 South to Atlanta. Take I-85 South until you get to Exit 44 (White Horse Road). Blue international hospital signs are posted along this route. Take the Exit 44 ramp, turn right onto Highway 25 and go to the second traffic light. Turn right onto Grove Road.



**From North Carolina via Highway 25 and 276 South:** Follow 25 and 276 into Greenville. They will merge into Highway 25 Business, also known as Buncombe Street. Continue on Buncombe Street, which will become one way (the name will change to North Street). You will cross Academy, Richardson, Main and Spring streets. Turn right onto Church Street. Continue straight on Church Street, which becomes Mills Avenue. Turn left onto Henrydale Avenue and right onto Grove Road.
